2.	Interview: Plan a time where you can meet, or speak over a video call with your family member. When the time comes, interview them by asking your prepared questions. Record your interview either with an "audio recorder" app or with video recording.

3.	Document and Transcribe - Download the audio/video file of the interview onto a laptop or play it from a phone. Carefully listen, pausing every few seconds, to type up or hand write what is said from the interview. Take or collect images of the person and any artifacts they may have related to their life experiences. Save all your work to a folder, a thumbdrive, send it in an email to someone you know, and/or print it out.
